**Federica Bucci** is a physiotherapist specializing in geriatric rehabilitation and pelvic floor rehabilitation. She holds a master's degree in Philosophical Sciences from the University of Macerata and a postgraduate specialization in Philosophy and History of Science and Technology from the University of Venice. Her research focuses on the philosophy of medicine, ethics of care, and the application of phenomenology to medicine and rehabilitation.

**Anne Fenoy** graduated from the Sorbonne University (Paris) in 2024 with a doctorate in the philosophy of medicine. Her thesis focused on the epistemic challenges of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS). She is currently working as a research engineer on two projects: one on ethical and epistemological issues involved in building a tool based on generative AI to help diagnose rare diseases as part of the QuickRare project (Shape-Med@Lyon, IRPHIL), and the other on epistemological and ethical issues involved in rare genetic diseases with psychiatric manifestations (GHU Paris Psychiatrie et Neurosciences).

**Mara Floris** is a researcher at Vita-Salute San Raffaele University in Milan. She earned her PhD with a thesis on the relationship between language and categorization in infants at the FINO consortium of the University of Turin. Currently, her research focuses on key areas such as scientific disinformation, communication between patients and healthcare practitioners, and gender studies. Alongside her research, she actively participates in science dissemination projects.

**Cristina Ganz** is a PhD candidate in Philosophy of Language at Università Vita-Salute San Raffaele in Milan. Funded by the PNRR, her research focuses on communication among perinatal practitioners and pregnant, parturient, and postpartum people. She aims to enhance perinatal care through effective communication strategies that minimise potential misunderstandings as well as epistemic, discursive, and affective injustices.

**Shane Glackin** is senior lecturer in Philosophy at the University of Exeter. His recent research focuses on the philosophy of medicine and psychiatry, metaethics, and philosophical methodology, and has appeared in venues like *Philosophy of Science*, *The Philosophical Quarterly*, *Philosophy of Medicine*, *the Journal of Moral Philosophy*, and the forthcoming *Oxford Handbook of Philosophy of Medicine*. He is currently interested in the relation between political theory and philosophy of medicine, and is also an Associate Editor for the *British Journal for the Philosophy of Science*.

**Noemi Paciscopi** is a PhD candidate in Philosophy at Università Vita-Salute San Raffaele in Milan. Her research lies at the intersection of epistemology and ethics and focuses on improving interactions between professionals in gynaecology and obstetrics and the individuals they care for, particularly during pregnancy, childbirth, and the postpartum period. She investigates how integrating the testimonies of healthcare professionals and pregnant, birthing, and postpartum women can enhance scientific knowledge and improve care practices.

**Wendy A. Rogers** is a professor and works in the field of practical bioethics. Her program of research is characterised by identifying practical problems, undertaking conceptual analysis of the underlying philosophical



and ethical issues, and developing responses that advance knowledge and contribute to practice. This approach draws upon both her medical and philosophical training. Her conceptual analysis and selection of issues are informed by my longstanding commitment to feminist bioethics.

**Giulia Santelli** is currently a master's student at Roma Tre University. She is pursuing a second master's degree in Cognitive Sciences, exploring the intersection of philosophy and neuroscience. Her current thesis investigates the concept of *akrasia* and addiction through the frameworks of Predictive Processing and Reinforcement Learning.

**Michel Shamy** is an associate professor of Neurology at the University of Ottawa, an Attending Neurologist at The Ottawa Hospital, and a Scientist at the Ottawa Hospital Research Institute. He earned his M.D. from Queen's University then completed residency in neurology at the University of Toronto, where he was chief resident. He was a fellow in the neurovascular / neurocritical care program at the University of California San Francisco and then a research fellow in the Calgary Stroke Program. His clinical work focuses on the care of patients with cerebrovascular disease. His research revolves around questions of epistemology and ethics, particularly as they play out in the design of randomized clinical trials.

**Frank Stahnisch** is professor at the Department of Community Health Sciences, Cumming School of Medicine, University of Calgary. His research attempts to create in-depth understanding for the development and necessities of basic research in medicine and the health sciences. It further places medicine and health care in the wider context of society and culture with their specific traditions of healing, inquiry, health care and patient support.

**Mary Jane Walker's** research is in bioethics, philosophy of medicine, and personal identity. In bioethics, her work has focused on ethical issues associated with emerging technologies, and ethical questions related to alcohol and drugs. In philosophy of medicine she has contributed to debates on definitions of disease. Her work on identity has examined narrative approaches to understanding persons, and their application to understanding ethical dimensions of self-change.

**Sloane Wesloh** is a PhD student in the Department of History and Philosophy of Science at the University of Pittsburgh. She studies the history and philosophy of medicine, especially the history of computing in medicine and the development of Electronic Medical Record systems. Her major research questions include how the practice of diagnosis and the concept of disease have been impacted by these histories, and by other technological shifts in the history of medicine.
